 hand Debts &c. together with all my wearing Apparel and
 Goods of and whatever else may belong to me at the time of
 my Decease And I do hereby appoint the aforesaid George
 Smith to be my sole and sole Executor Discharging and
 revoking all other Wills I have herewith set my hand and
 seal this 2nd Day of September in the Year of our Lord one
 thousand seven hundred and eighty six - The Mark of Sarah Jones
 My said Seal and Testated to be the last Will and Testament
 of the above Sarah Jones in the presence of us Witnesses - William
 Praumont - George Moore - John Newman

This Will was proved at London the nineteenth Day of
 December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
 ninety three before the Reverend Samuel Pearce Parson Doctor
 of Laws and Surrogate of the Right Honourable Sir William
 Wynne Knight and Doctor of Laws Quarter Master of
 the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the
 Oath of George Smith the Grandson of the Deceased and the
 sole Executor named in the said will to whom Administration
 of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the Deceased
 was granted having been first sworn duly to Administer.

 given to me Ellen Fison in and by a certain Bond Contract or
 Security entered into by my Dear Father ^{and Mother} upon my Marriage
 which said Contract or Security bears Date the 25th of February

 Trust to pay the said sum of Money to her and in case of
 her Death before twenty one upon Trust to pay the said
 sum to ~~my said Dear~~ my said Dear
 Husband John Wm Fison his Executors or Administrators to and for
 his and their own use and benefit I request my Good Father
 may be given to my said Daughter also all my Rings and
 Jewels I revoke all other Wills and Testaments this to be my
 last I appoint Mr Fison Sen: Mr B: Clarkson and my said

Husband Executors heretofore written with my own hand the twentieth
 fifth Day of December 1784. Ellen Jordan Esq. signed sealed and
 Delivered by the said Ellen Jordan and witnessed and Delivered by
 her as and for her last will and Testament the 25th Day of
 December 1784 in the presence of - Justice of the Peace, J. M. Wilby & C.
 W. S. Armstrong.

This Will was proved at London the first Day of
 December in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
 and ninety three before the Right Honourable Sir William
 Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws Master Chieftain or Commissioner of
 the prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the
 Oaths of John Jordan and John Wilm Jordan the Husband of the
 Deceased and the surviving Executors named in the said will to
 whom administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels and
 Credits of the said Deceased was granted they having been first
 sworn (to wit) the said John Jordan before the Reverend George
 Harris and the said John Wilm Jordan before the Reverend
 Samuel Pearce Parson respectively Doctors of Laws and Surrogates
 July to administer.

In the Name of God Amen John
 John Kent of Waverton in the County of Northampton
 being of sound and disposing Mind Memory and Understanding
 do make and publish this my last will and Testament in the
 manner following (that is to say) first I direct that all my
 Just Debts funeral Expenses and the Costs and Charges of proving
 this my will be in the first place paid and discharged by my
 Executor hereinafter named also I do give and bequeath unto
 my sister Mary Parkins (wife of Thomas Parkins of the parish
 of Olney in the said County of Northampton the sum of twenty pounds
 of lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid to her by my
 Executors hereinafter named within six months after my Decease
 To Mary Parkins Daughter of the said Thomas and Mary
 Parkins the sum of ten pounds of like Money to be paid
 to her by my Executors hereinafter named within six
 months next after my Decease But if the said Mary Parkins
 the Daughter shall not then have attained unto her age of
 twenty one years then when and so soon she shall attain
 unto that age also I do give and bequeath unto Mary
 Carter my servant (if living with me at the time of my Decease
 but not otherwise) the sum of five pounds of like Money to
 be paid to her by my Executor hereinafter named
 immediately after my Decease also I give and bequeath
 unto the Reverend Daniel Slipton Rector of Waverton and
 aforesaid John Warram of Waverton aforesaid and John
 Thornton of Woburn Draper all and singular my Goods in
 Trade and Business Goods Chattels Rights Credits personal and
 Estate and Effects whatsoever and of what nature kind or
