in the County of Stafford Picture I give and bequeath unto my Dear wife Jane Talbott all my Household Goods and Furniture Browsing Vessels & Tools in Effects whatsoever and all my personal Estate and Lands & Estates whatsoever and whatsoever for her sole and separate use and benefit she paying out all my just Debts funeral and Extraordinary Expenses and I do appoint my said wife Jane Talbott sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament looking all other Wills by me made before made void and this only to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this twenty eighth Day of September in the year of our Lord Matthew Talbott <sup>1610</sup> Eight hundred and five <sup>1610</sup> This writing was signed by me published and declared by me to be my will and Testament in his presence at his request and in the presence of one other person present subscribed and attested as witness H. Mo. Hartshorne H. Sam. Harding

This 25<sup>th</sup> 1610 was proved at London the twenty first Day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred and eight hundred and eight before the Right Honourable Sir William Waynflete Knight Doctor of Laws Master Keeper of the Commission of the Procurator Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the will of Jane Talbott widow of Robert Talbott and sole Executrix named in the said will to whom administration was granted of all and singular her Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased having been first sworn by Commission duly to answer.

This is the first will of Jane Talbott late of Mortecastle in the County of Cumberland widow of George Brugge of Great Cumberland place aforesaid the sum of two hundred Guineas I give unto Robert Winsor who did formerly reside at New Hove and the Minster at Hemy Stratford in the County of Birmingham and was afterwards an apprentice to an apothecary at Chelsea twenty Guineas also as to all the rest = residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects of what Nature or kind soever I give and

bequeath the same unto Sir George Brudenell-Tapps  
of Brinton Admiral in the County of Southampton  
Baronet his Executors Administrators and Assigns  
to and for his and their own use and benefit  
absolutely it he shall be living at the time  
of my death but if not then I give and bequeath  
the same unto such of his Children as shall  
be then living equally to be divided between  
them it more than one and if but one  
then wholly to such only Child to and for  
them in his or her own use and benefit but if  
the said Sir George Brudenell-Tapps shall happen  
to die in my life time and there shall be no  
Child of him living at the time of my death  
then I give and bequeath the whole of the  
said residuum of my Estate and Effects unto  
Samuel Sarah Tapps his wife after Sir George =  
Tapps his Executors Administrators and Assigns =  
to and for her and their own use and benefit  
absolutely and I appoint the said Sir George  
Brudenell-Tapps sole Executor of this my  
last will and Testament by witness = = =  
of arof 1 year ensuing st my hand and  
Seal this twenty second Day of March One  
thousand Eight hundred and eight & Jane  
Tapps (J) signed and sealed by the said =  
testatrix and by her husband and = = =  
Carlaw as and for her last will and Testament
