 one thousand eight hundred and five At
 Matthew Talbot This writing was signed
 sealed published and declared by the said =
 Testator Matthew Talbot as and for his last
 will and Testament in his presence at
 his Request and in the presence of some other
 lawful witnesses subscribed our Names as

 was proved at London the twenty
 first day of June in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and eight before =
 the Right Honourable Sir William Wynne Knight
 Doctor of Laws Master Keeper of our Majesty
 of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully
 constituted by the oath of Jane Talbot widow
 the Relict and sole Executrix named in the said
 will to whom Administration was granted
 of all and singular the Goods Chattels and
 Credits of the said deceased having been
 first sworn by Commission only to administer

This is the Last Will and Testament
 of me Jane Tapp late of Northchurch
 County of Middlesex Widow I give unto Sir George
 Buggin of Great Cumberland Place aforesaid
 the sum of two hundred Guineas I give unto =
 John Winsore who did formerly reside at the
 house of Mr. Pinnitts at Henry Stratford in
 the County of Buckingham and was afterwards
 an apprentice to an apothecary at Chelsea
 twenty Guineas And as to all the rest =
 residue and Remainder of my Estate and Effects

 of Binton Admiral in the County of Southampton
 Baronet his Executors Admors and assignes
 to and for his and their own use and benefit
 absolutely if he shall be living at the time
 of my decease but if not then I give and bequeath
 the same unto such of his Children as shall
 be then living equally to be divided between
 them if more than one and if but one
 then wholly to such only Child to and for
 their use and their own use and benefit but if
 the said Sir George Arison Tappes shall happen
 to die in my life time and then shall be no
 Child of him living at the time of my decease
 then I give and bequeath the whole of the
 said residue of my Estate and Effects unto
 Dame Sarah Tappes the wife of Sir George
 Tappes her Executors Admors and assignes
 to and for her and their own use and benefit
 absolutely and I appoint the said Sir George
 Arison Tappes sole Executor of this my
 last will and Testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 Seal this twenty second Day of March one

 Testatrix and by her published and
 declared as and for her last will and Testament
 in the presence of us who in her presence

 Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted
